

# At-Home Activities BINGO

## TK - September

Initial next to each activity your child completes at home this month. Return to the teacher at any time by October 2<sup>nd</sup>. For each "BINGO" your child gets, he will be able to choose one sticker from our classroom sticker box!

<p>Letter Chalk Jumping – draw this month’s letters outside with chalk. Call them out and have your child jump to each one. (Could also practice with sounds)</p>	<p>Shape Scavenger Hunt – what 2-D shapes can you find around your house? BONUS: Take pictures &amp; make a shape book!</p>	<p>Rainbow Writing – write your sight words at least 3 times using a different color each time writing them.</p>	<p>Copy Patterns – Create a pattern using objects from your house or outside and see if your child can copy it.</p>	<p>Cutting Practice – Practice snipping the edges of the paper. (Can use scrap paper or green construction paper to make “grass”)</p>
<p>Fine Motor Practice – draw numbers on pieces of paper. Have your child place small objects (ex buttons) on the number to make it.</p>	<p>Measuring – use different size containers to pour water in the bathtub or sink. Talk about words such as more/less and full/empty.</p>	<p>Cook or bake something together in the kitchen! Let your child help with measuring ingredients &amp; reading the numbers on the recipe</p>	<p>Build This Month’s Letters – you can use playdough, pipecleaners, wiki sticks, buttons, or whatever you want to make them!</p>	<p>Write this month’s sight words on pieces of paper &amp; hang around the room. Call out the word &amp; have your child run &amp; tap it.</p>
<p>Find the Letters in Your Name – Look in a magazine or newspaper. Find all the letters in your name &amp; paste them on a piece of paper.</p>	<p>Counting Practice – count to 20 in different silly voices! Try doing it at least 3 different ways.</p>	<p>Free Space</p>	<p>Shaving Cream Shapes – draw 2-D shapes in shaving cream! Talk about the characteristics/ names of each one.</p>	<p>Letters in Books – While reading together, see what letters your child can point to in the book.</p>
<p>Draw 2-D shapes in the dirt outside using a stick! You could also create 2-D shapes using items found in nature.</p>	<p>Go on a nature walk. What do you see?</p>	<p>Act out a Bible story from one week this month!</p>	<p>Subitizing Practice – roll dice. See if your child can say how many without counting. How quickly can your child do it? Take turns rolling &amp; saying how many.</p>	<p>Write your name in salt, sand, or sugar! Place salt in a tray and use your finger to write the letters in your name.</p>
<p>Draw a picture of a Bible story from one week this month.</p>	<p>String beads on pipe cleaners! You could even make bracelets or necklaces! ☺</p>	<p>Rhyming Songs – listen to/sing songs with rhymes &amp; point out the rhyming words you hear.</p>	<p>Plant a Fall vegetable garden &amp; care for it together. Some ideas: radishes, garlic, leaf lettuce, or spinach.</p>	<p>Cut apples in half. Dip in paint to use as stamps on a piece of paper!</p>
